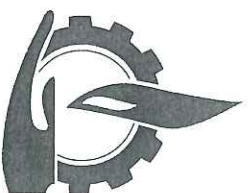

External Students

All external students MUST submit FULL TRANSCRIPT of relevant Qualifications/ results. The transcript must show the overall result and average/GPA.

Transcripts of qualifications obtained prior to the current year, MUST be submitted WITH the Direct Application.

DIRECT ADMISSIONS GUIDELINES

Direct Application - For Whom?

- The Direct Application form must be completed by all candidates seeking admission to -
- an add-on Ordinary Bachelor Degree (Level 7), Honours Bachelor Degree (Level 8), Degree of Master - taught (Level 9) or for transfer to the second or other stage of any programme (Levels 6, 7 or 8);
 - any programme that you wish to pursue through the ACCM mode. Details of the ACCM mode (Accumulation of Credits and Certification of Modules) are contained in the prospectus.

Entry Requirements

Entry requirements for all programmes are detailed in the Institute Prospectus.

Closing Date

The closing date for receipt of completed applications is: 1st May.
Applications for all programmes (in all campuses) should be returned to:

Late Applications
Late applications may be considered after the autumn re-sit examination session, subject to places being available.

Acknowledgement

Please enter your name and address on the acknowledgement section of the application form.
The acknowledgement will be stamped by the Office of Academic Affairs and sent back to you immediately.
Incomplete applications or applications without the necessary transcripts will not be acknowledged and will be returned.

Offers/Confirmation of Place

Round Zero

Defer applicants, and applicants who interrupted/deferred before the beginning of April, will be offered places in mid April.

Offers will have to be accepted by a specific date (as printed on *Offer Notice*), generally towards the end of May.

Round One

Eligible GMT students will be offered places from 20th June.

Any student NOT intending to take up their place in GMT in September must advise the Admissions Office of their decision within two weeks of the receipt of confirmation of their place on the programme.

Other Higher Education Institution students will be offered any available places in early July. Offers will have to be accepted by a specified date, generally within two weeks of the offer date.

Further Offers

Any available places will be offered to applicants who remain on the ranked Waiting Lists as they occur.

Progression / Selection / Ranking

Progression to add-on Ordinary or Honours Degrees

If you have passed your Higher Certificate or Ordinary Degree examinations, you are eligible to progress to a related higher level award subject to the availability of places.

Selection and Ranking

Only applications received by the due date will be considered valid for the summer offer session. Late applications may be considered after the autumn re-sit examination session, subject to the availability of places.

After the results of the *summer examination session* are published, the following criteria will apply to applicants for places on all add-on programmes:

- All qualified candidates, at that time, will be categorised into those who hold:
 - GMT awards, ranked in order of performance,[†] and
 - External awards from other institutions, ranked in order of performance.
- GMT applicants will be offered places, in decreasing order of performance, until the number of available places is exhausted.
- If places remain unfilled, external candidates will be offered places, in decreasing order of performance, until the number of available places is exhausted.

After the results of the *autumn examination session* are published, any remaining unfilled places will be offered to those candidates who have obtained GMT awards, in that session, in decreasing order of performance, until the number of available places is exhausted. Subsequently, where places remain unfilled, they will be offered to all remaining qualified candidates, including late applicants, in decreasing order of performance.

[[†]Applicants for the Honours Degrees in Fine Art and Design in Textiles will be ranked on a combination of academic performance and interview/assessment.]

Transfers

Students applying to transfer to the second or other stage of a programme will be subject to places being available on that programme. Offers for any available places will be made by the end of July. Students applying for a programme in the ACCM mode will be subject to an interview.

Fees and Higher Education Grants

- Students applying for admission to add-on honours degrees should also apply to their local authority for a higher education grant at this time, regardless of whether you hold or have been in receipt of a grant.
- Non-EU applicants will be liable for the economic fee and should contact the Fees Office before applying.
