12.	Rationale for Changes:	The BSc (Hons) in Medical Science is a 4-year programme, which includes a mandatory clinical placement in year 3. Over the past few years some learners for a variety of reasons wish to exit with a level 7 award.		
		The availability of a level 7 exit award in Medical Science also follows the recommendation of an external panel following differential validation of the programme in December 2020.		
13.	Overview of Changes:	Approval was sought for a BSc in Medical Science. This equates to the first three years of the level 8 programme, and has its own Programme Learning Outcomes, entry requirements, APS, rationale, employment opportunities etc.		
14.	Resource Implications:	None.		
15.		The panel were satisfied that there was a rationale for the programme and that graduates of the level 7 programme would be employable in laboratories. The panel approves the validation of the NFQ Level 7 BSc in Medical Science (exit award) with the commendations listed below and subject to the following condition(s) and recommendation(s): Commendations: 1. The provision of clear and comprehensive documentation and the positive engagement of the Programme Board with the panel. 2. The students the panel met with are good ambassadors for the programme. 3. The Programme Board are evidently student centric as exemplified by the introduction of level seven exit award. 4. There is a clear focus on sustainability by the School who are working to achieve Green Lab status. 5. Lecturing staff are proactive in embracing teaching and learning innovation e.g., E-portfolio award, use of recorded lectures.
