What is Early Childhood Education and Care?

The BA in Early Childhood Education and Care focuses on the education and care of children from birth to six years.

It is designed to provide learners with the skills and competencies required for autonomous working practice in Early Childhood Education and Care.

The course is based on a child-led transformational philosophy which enables students to build authentic reciprocal relationships with children, parents, colleagues, the community and other professionals.

This degree is based on the contemporary principles of best practice as determined by Siolta, The National Quality Framework for Early Childhood Education (2006) and Aistear, The Early Childhood Curriculum Framework (2009).



Career Opportunities

The BA in Early Childhood Education and Care will be recognised for the higher capitation of the Early Childhood Care and Education programme (free pre-school year) under the Department of Children and Youth Affairs (DCYA) list of recognised qualifications.

Career opportunities include:

- Manager in an Early Years setting
- Working with children with disabilities
- Special Educational Needs Assistant
- Tutor for QQI level 5 and 6 in Early Childhood Education and Care

Further Study

Following successful completion of the Level 8 in Early Childhood Education and Care, graduates can undertake a variety of career paths in the education, health and social care fields. There is a current need for well-trained graduates who can quickly move up to more senior roles in early childhood education and care settings.

Some students may go on to specialise in a particular area such as Post Graduate level in Special Educational Needs or Play Therapy; others may take up advisory posts or mentoring roles in government departments.

Students may continue their professional studies to Masters Level including Leadership in Early Childhood Education, Primary Education, Psychology and Play Therapy.
